15.00 – Depart.



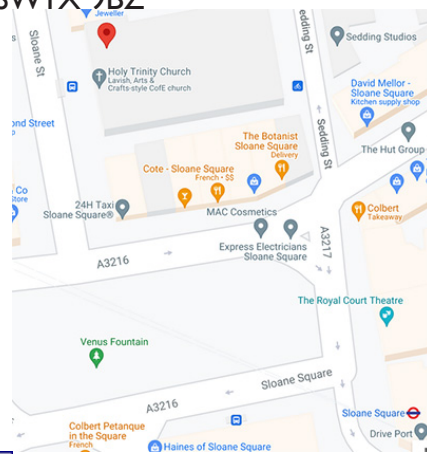
